She was always old to me, but it seemed as though she would live forever. She could get down on the ground and right back up and loved to show us that she could still touch her toes in her 90’s.

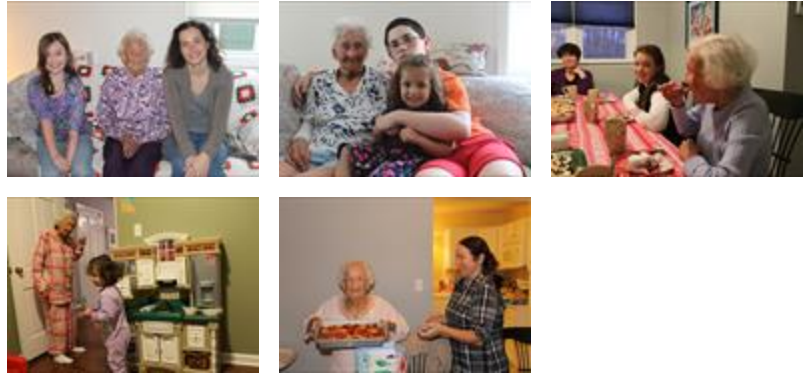
